This study is designed to help your community group grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. There are three dimensions to following Jesus.



UP: growing in relationship with God

IN: growing in relationship with other followers of Jesus

OUT: growing in relationship with the world around us as we join God in God's mission.

Get Started:

Describe a time when someone (family, friend, etc.) stuck with you during a difficult season of life. How did knowing they were available to you influence your experience of that season?

UP: Connect with God through Spending Time in His Word

Read aloud the passage for the week: 2 Thessalonians 2:13-3:5. Allow a few moments to silently reflect on what you heard. Underline or note words or phrases that seem meaningful. Pray for your study of God's Word.

- 1. Reread verses 13-14. How might these serve as encouragement in a challenging time of life?
- 2. Reread verse 2:15. Why do you think Paul encourages the Thessalonians to hold fast to the apostles' teachings? What role does scripture play in your life when things get hard?
- 3. Reread 3:1. According to a recent poll from the Barna Group, 47% of practicing Christians between the ages of 20-35 say that evangelism is wrong¹. What do you think about Paul's prayer request in this verse?
- 4. Reread 3:3-5. Do you feel you can trust the Lord to strengthen you and Christ's ability to persevere during difficult times? Why or why not?
- 5. How might these verses encourage you to grow in faith, love, and perseverance in a difficult season of life?
