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

#### **READ HEBREWS 11:1-12:3**

In our reading, Paul gives us a definition for faith in the very first verse. Paul has two names, actually, Saul and Paul. We'll use both all month long, so don't be confused! Back to what Paul says about faith—to put it simply, faith is trusting in what you can't see because of what you can see.

Paul also gives a very long list of people whose faith changed their lives and the lives of those around them.

Who is someone you know who has a big, growing faith?

#### DAY 3

You can talk to God just like you talk to your mom or dad. You can tell Him anything—even talk about your day! Talking to God is one of the best ways to grow your faith. Fill in the blanks below, then read the prayer to God.

#### Hey God!

You already know this, but it's me, <u>(Your Name)</u>. I want to get better at talking to You, because I want to grow my faith.








Learning how to talk about your faith with others can be tough especially if you're new to faith, or you still aren't sure exactly what you believe. But anything is possible with a little practice.

I need Your help every day. In the Bible, we are reminded time and time again that You are always with us. Would you be with me (a time in the future you want God's help)?


God, one thing I love about You is (one thing you love about God).

#### **READ ACTS 9:10-31**

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


#### **READ ACTS 10**

A lot happened when Peter visited Cornelius. Take out a separate sheet of paper. In your own words, write down the three most important things that happened.

God gave Peter a vision, which is kind of like a dream. God showed Peter that anything and anyone He created could never be "unclean." God loved the Jewish people and the non-Jewish people the same. God wants everyone to have faith; not just the popular people.

Is there someone at school or church who is viewed as "unclean?" Maybe they're not literally dirty, but they are not popular. They eat lunch alone and they are the last to be picked to be on a team or in a group. Based on what you read today, do you think God sees them the way you and others see them? How do you think God sees them?



## DAY 3

Sometimes, it's hard to be honest with God about things that embarrass us. There's another word for that feeling—shame. And God doesn't want us to feel that way. One way to fight the feelings of shame is to be open with God. This is one important way we can grow our faith.

Fill in the blanks below, then read the prayer to God.

#### God.

It's hard for me to admit, but there are times I don't treat everyone the same. For example, (talk to God about a time you didn't treat someone the way you want to be treated). Help me to remember that you want everyone to have faith in You. Everyone, including me! Remind me to talk to You even when I'm feeling shame. Amen.

## DAY 4

Not everyone hears from God like Peter did in a vision. But there are other ways to know what He thinks and wants.

Who is someone in your life who talks about God like He's their friend? Take a couple of minutes to talk to them. You can text, email, or even video chat them. Ask them how they hear from God. You may connect with God in a different way, but hearing others share about their experiences with God grows both of your faiths.



Peter learned that God wants us to treat everyone the same. That doesn't mean we have to be best friends with every single person at our school. But it does mean He wants us to show everyone the same amount of respect and kindness.

Think about one person you haven't been so kind to in the past. Maybe you haven't done anything to them, but you've thought unkind thoughts or gone out of your way to avoid them. This could be someone at school, someone in your neighborhood, or even your brother or sister. (That's right! God wants us to treat our siblings with respect and kindness, too!)

Challenge yourself to treat them differently. On a sheet of paper, write down three things you can do to show this person respect and kindness.



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#### **READ EPHESIANS 2:8-9**

We learn a lot about grace in those verses.

- 1. Graces saves us
- 2. Grace doesn't come from anything we do
- 3. No one can earn grace

#### WE LEARN THAT GRACE IS A GIFT.

It's the gift of forgiveness every time we mess up.

It's the gift of being loved by God before we even know who He is.

It's the gift of being in God's family forever, no matter what.

Grace is the best kind of gift, because it's given to everyone. It's just like we said last week—Jesus is a gift for everyone.

Sometimes, it can be hard to understand grace because it's almost too good to be true. We can get forgiveness no matter what? But it is true! Jesus was born, lived, and died so that we could have grace.

When's the last time something happened to you that seemed too good to be true? How did it feel?

## DAY 3

Talking to God is one of the best ways to grow your faith. You can talk to God just like you talk to your parents or friends. Fill in the blanks below, then read the prayer to God.

#### **Hey God!**

I'm so glad I can talk to you about anything, any time. It's pretty cool that you listen to me. It's even more cool that you want to hear what I am thinking and feeling.

Right now, I am learning about grace and it's pretty awesome. It's amazing that You love us so much that You sent your Son Jesus so that I can have forgiveness when I mess up. You know, like that one time I (a time you messed up) \_\_\_\_\_\_\_.

Because of grace, anytime I ask for forgiveness, You give me forgiveness. Because of that, You want me to forgive others when they mess up. Even when it's really, really hard.

That's why I want to forgive (someone who did something to hurt you)

DAY 4 Do you know someone who seems to be filled with grace? Someone who is able to control their temper, forgive, and let go of anger? Maybe it's your soccer coach or teacher. It could be your stepmom or grandpa. Take some time today or tomorrow to reach out to that person.

If you can't do it in person, you can text, email, or even video call them. Ask them to tell you how they find the strength and courage to forgive and ask for forgiveness. Ask them how they came to be filled with the gift of grace.





Is there someone in your family that you need to ask for forgiveness? Maybe you snapped at your mom this morning. Or you disobeyed your stepdad. Or, is there someone in your family that you need to forgive? Are you still mad at your brother for taking your slime to school?

Take a couple of minutes to talk to them.

Ask or offer them grace.

You'll both walk away feeling better after experiencing grace.



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#### **READ ACTS 17:16-34**

Acts was probably written by one of Jesus' followers named Luke. In the book of Acts, Luke talks a lot about a guy named Saul. After meeting Jesus and becoming a Jesus-follower, Saul's entire life changed. He was even given another name—Paul. After meeting Jesus and realizing that Jesus is God's Son, Paul traveled everywhere he could to share his faith, moving people closer and closer to a faith of their own.

One of the towns Paul visited was named Athens. And something bad was going on there. Here's what the Bible says:

"Paul was waiting for Silas and Timothy in Athens. He was very upset to see that the city was full of statues of gods." Acts 17:16, NIrV

The people of Athens were worshipping statues and not the one true God. The people of Athens were very, very far from having faith. So, Paul decided to do something about it. He decided to draw the people closer to a real faith of their own.

Talking to God is one of the best ways to grow your faith. You can talk to God just like you talk to your parents or friends. Fill in the blanks below, then read the prayer to God.


#### **Hey God!**

If you want to help people find their way to Jesus, you have to take the first step. Here are a few examples of first steps you could take.

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#### READ ACTS 27:1-28:10

So far, Paul has had some pretty incredible things happen to him. But what happened to Paul next is going to blow your mind.

Paul had a few problems. The first problem was Paul was put in jail. Why was he put in jail? The short answer is that Paul was in jail because he was a Jesus-follower. One day, while Paul was still a prisoner, it was decided that he would travel by boat across the Mediterranean Sea to stand trial.

From the beginning of the trip, Paul knew the journey wouldn't be an easy one. The wind began to blow and the waves were getting bigger and bigger. Before long, the boat struggled to stay on course. On top of that, the trip was taking way longer than planned and the food supply was running low. With winter and more bad weather coming, Paul was worried they'd never make it.

#### Paul tried to tell the ship's commander:

"'Men,' he said, 'I can see that our trip is going to be dangerous. The ship and everything in it will be lost. Our own lives will be in danger also.' But the commander didn't listen to what Paul said." Acts 27:10-11, NIrV

Paul had quite a few problems:

- 1. Paul was being held prisoner because of his faith.
- 2. Paul was on a ship without enough food in the middle of a storm.
- 3. Paul knew they were in big trouble, but no one would listen.

## DAY 3

Each and every day you are faced with problems of all sizes. You can't find your book bag, or your teacher caught you in a lie, or you forgot to tell your mom that your lunch account ran out of money. Did you know that you can talk to God about your problems? In fact, God wants us to tell Him about anything that bothers us or hurts us.


Take a few minutes and tell God about anything that's on your mind right now. What's worrying you? Frustrating you? Hurting you? Tell God about your problems like you're talking to a friend or your parents.

**God hears your words.** And just like He was with Paul, He will be with you in the middle of all your problems.

#### DAY 4

Do you know someone who has been through a lot of tough situations, but still has a big, growing faith in God? Someone who has faced big problems but still loves and follows God?

**Take some time to talk to that person.** If you can't do it in person, you can text, email, or even video call them. Ask them how they kept their faith strong when things were tough.





Did you know that when you show faith during your hard times, it helps others get through their hard times?

## Here are three things Paul did during his hard time to help others during their hard time:

- 1. You can tell others that God keeps His promises. It can be hard to know what to say to someone who is hurting, especially if you're hurting, too. But you can always remind them that God is a good, loving God, and that He is always with us, even when it feels like He's not.
- 2. You can have hope. You can be positive when everything feels negative. Saying things like, "God's got this," and "I'm here for you," seems small, but it can go a long way to change someone's attitude when they're down.
- 3. You can pray. Paul prayed out loud where everyone could hear him. You don't have to pray out loud if that makes you nervous or uncomfortable, but you can tell someone that you're praying for them. Don't forget to actually pray!

From the list above, which will be the easiest thing for you to do to help a friend when you're both faced with a problem?

Which will be the most challenging?

The next time you're faced with a hard situation, ask yourself how you can continue to show faith so that you can help others grow their faith, too.



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#### **READ REVELATION 21:3-5A**

The book we're reading from this week is called Revelation. Revelation basically means *made known*. And in the book of Revelation, we uncover many truths about what heaven is like. Check out what Revelation says about heaven:

"... God now makes his home with the people. He will live with them. They will be his people. And God himself will be with them and be their God." Revelation 21:3, NIrV

We learn one important fact about heaven: **GOD WILL BE THERE.** He will actually live with us in Heaven. He will be our God—meaning, He will be in charge. That sounds amazing, right?

We're going to talk a lot about heaven this week. Before we get there, think about this . . .

If you could ask one question about heaven, what would it be?


## DAY 3

One of the most important ways to following Jesus is to talk to Him. He wants you to tell Him everything—even ask Him questions.

Look at your question from yesterday. **Spend a few minutes praying to God, telling Him you're curious about heaven.** Tell Him you want to know more about it—more about Him.

#### DAY 4

Following Jesus will turn out greater than you can imagine. It's true! Do you know someone who is following Jesus right now? Take some time to talk to that person. If you can't do it in person, you can text, email, or even video call them. Ask them all the ways that following Jesus has been good—even great—for them.

If you have time, ask them what they think about heaven. What will it be like? Compare what they think to what you think!




After the author of Revelation tells us what He saw in his vision of Heaven, the One sitting on the throne says,

"Write this down. You can trust these words. They are true." Revelation 21:5b, NIrV

This verse tells us the most important part of having faith—you can trust what God says. You can trust that Jesus is His One and only Son, sent to earth so that we could be in God's family forever. When we are faced with something hard or something confusing, we can have faith and trust in God. We can follow Jesus. We can know that no matter what, God loves us and Jesus wants to have a relationship with us.

There are already ways following God has helped your life. Think of one person you can talk to about the ways following God has turned out greater than you imagined. Tell them about Him, about His love, and about how following God is the best choice you've ever made.
