Since its inception in Falls Church, Virginia, in 1994, The Fellows Initiative (thefellowsinitiative.org) has spread across the country, giving recent college graduates an intentional bridge to move from college to professional life with their faith fully integrated. Financial Peace University

Long a GTW offering, Dave Ramsey's Financial Peace University will expand this fall to offer three options per week to attend the class:

- Wednesday nights at GTW, 6:15 p.m.
- Tuesday mornings, women-only class, 9 a.m.
- Sunday mornings at 10 a.m.

Facilitator Louise Carlson shares the following stories of past FPU participants who have experienced amazing changes and gained significant freedom by applying what they learned in the course:

- A military couple built an emergency fund and were able to pay for a broken windshield. For the first time ever, they saved up for Christmas rather than charging it.
- A couple in ministry learned to take control of their investments.
- A newly-married couple learned how to budget and pay for her going back to school for a Master's degree.
- Two self-employed people learned how to budget for an irregular income.



Songwriter Finds a Voice

In the Songwriter's Workshop, we met a guy who had become a Christian a couple years ago. He had enjoyed writing country music and blues songs, but now he wanted to write songs about Jesus. He was wondering if he could find a way to share his faith through music. He had become a little discouraged, but then his wife showed him this class in the GTW catalog. He came and was encouraged to find he was not alone. Playing in front of the class was a big step for him. He says—and his wife also told me later—that it changed his voice: "I realized I couldn't just sing halfway if I was going to do this in front of the group." We were stunned; what a wonderful and powerful voice he has!
